Flu Vaccination - please give or withhold consent as soon as possible

Please complete the <u>Consent for Flu Nasal Spray form</u> using school code BK110153B to either **give or withhold consent**. You will need your child's NHS number which can be found <u>here</u> if not known. If your child is unable to have the nasal flu vaccine due to the porcine gelatine, there is an alternative injectable flu vaccine - see <u>letter</u> for further information.

Parents are invited into school on Wednesday 16 October for the Year 7 Pastoral and Workshare Evening. Please note this is **not a formal parents evening** with individual feedback on attainment/progress, but the opportunity for your son to show you around his classrooms, share some of his work and to have informal conversations with teachers. Additionally you will be able to book via schoolcloud a five minute appointment to meet with your son's form tutor to discuss how he is settling in from a pastoral perspective. To login to schoolcloud please use your son's full first name, as shortened versions are not recognised. **Booking via schoolcloud opens 7am Tuesday 8 October** and will close at midday on Tuesday 15 October (instructions here).

There is no formal start time or presentation, so please arrive anytime to suit from 6pm parking on surrounding roads considerately for our neighbours. If your son normally travels home on the coach he can remain at school and meet up with you when you arrive. On arrival please make your way to the Dining Room to sign in and pick up a map showing teacher's locations for the evening. In an attempt to spread people around the school you are asked to follow the route shown below according to the first letter of your surname:

- A-G Science Block --> Main House --> Maths Wing
- H-O Maths Wing --> Science Block --> Main House
- P-Z Main House --> Maths Wing --> Science Block

Year 11 Mock Examinations - w/c 18 & 25 November



Sickness Absence

Medical/Dental Appointments

Term Time Absence

Please see our <u>Attendance and Holidays in Term Time Policy</u> noting that absence for holidays is not encouraged during term time and will not normally be authorised for the first or last week of any term. If you do wish the headteacher to review a request please complete the <u>Online Holiday Request Form</u>.

Leaving School / Returning to School during the School Day

If you are collecting your son for an appointment during the school day, he should wait in reception at the allotted time. When you have arrived outside to pick him up, please call the school on 01628 327600 and we will sign him out and send him out to you. Pupils are not permitted to wait outside or use their phones in reception. When your son returns to school, he must sign in at reception before going to lessons so that we know he is back in school.

Illness and Games afternoons

If your son is unable to play sport, he is expected to accompany his year group to games and will be given an alternative role.
