'RETHINKING MASCULINITY' WORKSHOPS

Over the past two Mondays, we have been delighted to welcome Matt Pinkett into our Senior schools, to work with boys and girls. Matt is an English teacher who is also a speaker and author on the subject of boys' mental health. We invited Matt to run assemblies at Senior Boys and Senior Girls' on the topic of 'calling out'. This involved strategies for pupils to call out their peers if they saw or heard something that, in their opinion, was inappropriate. This included learning to use the phrase 'Come off it Mate'.

Matt then ran individual workshops with boys and girls (together) from Years 7, 8 and 9. These were around the topic of masculinity and what it means to 'be a male'. It was very interesting to hear the views of both the boys and the girls. Examples included "aggressive; tough; sporty; strong". They examined what males 'are expected to be like' and this was put in the 'Man Box'. Matt also discussed some statistics about males. The groups then created a new 'Claires Court Man Box', which included attributes such as "kind; gentle; males can show

emotions".

REMINDERS CHROMEBOOKS

Please find our <u>Chromebook Provision and Policy</u> as a reminder that pupils and parents are responsible for the chromebook that your daughter has been allocated, including any repairs/replacement due to damage/loss. Should you require the school to source you a new chromebook please email your daughter's form tutor to authorise the cost of approx. £250 being added to your fee invoice. If you decide to purchase your own replacement **chromebook** (please note other platforms/devices are not permitted in school e.g. laptops, apple as they are not compatible with our systems), you will need the Claires Court Google licence added to the chromebook at a cost of £35, again to be authorised by emailing your daughter's form tutor.

LEAVING SCHOOL / RETURNING TO SCHOOL DURING THE SCHOOL DAY

If you are collecting your daughter for an appointment during the school day, she should wait in reception at the allotted time. We do require parents/guardians to collect and sign your daughter out of school - we will not let a pupil leave school on their own to go to an appointment. Pupils are not

permitted to wait outside or use their phones in reception. When your daughter returns to school, she must sign in at reception before going to lessons so that we know she is back in school.
