Local Flooding Chaos

The very serious flooding that has taken place in the Cookham/Maidenhead area has for our local area caused some significant problems and delays; families in Cookham village itself have had only one route out, with the river road to school and the route over Winter Hill to Marlow both closed as a consequence.
