End of Day Collections



ISC's legal challenge re. VAT on school tuition fees

The Independent Schools Council (ISC) Board voted in October to begin legal action over the government's decision to introduce VAT on independent school fees. Before the Christmas break, families supported by the ISC filed a judicial review claim in the High Court of England and Wales and, in January, it was agreed that this legal action should be fast tracked. The defendant to the claim is the chancellor, Rachel Reeves, as the minister responsible for the Treasury. The court case backed by the ISC will be heard in the High Court next week, from 1 - 3 April.
