This week at Nursery:



Our VE day celebrations were a wonderful opportunity to help the children understand past and present, the importance of kindness and looking at the country they live in. They created flags, we danced to 1940s music and looked at photos of soldiers from World War 2 and the parties which happened once the war was over. We acknowledged the feeling of being safe; who and what makes us safe.



Bumble Bees enjoyed looking at caterpillars and butterflies. They read The Very Hungry Caterpillar, learning new vocabulary like chrysalis.



The Beehive and Busy Bees class have spent a lot of time in their outdoor classroom this week. Here, they have been able to extend their development in all areas.

- <u>Threading</u> pre writing skills: hand eye coordination, concentration, visual tracking skills
- <u>Role play</u> language development, negotiation, being creative, self regulation
- <u>Creating their own physical developmental limitations</u> core strength, self esteem and self confidence
- <u>Messy sensory play</u> pre writing skills, cognitive skills, emotional regulation, problem solving, maths and science foundation
- <u>Exploring the pond and growing area</u> observational skills, language development, connection to their environment, curiosity and wonder, safety education



Inside, the learning through play has continued with recycling games and activities and the children using the old socks which many of you bought in. The children have also been working in small groups on numbers, mathematical language, letter sounds and language.



At Forest School this week, the children created their own tree faces using clay and other natural materials they could find. As always, there is also the opportunity to climb the ditch, which is a weekly love of theirs.
