From the office, Robyn, Dexter and everyone at Claires Court Juniors, we wish you a wonderful Christmas break and look forward to seeing you in January 2026.














Merry Christmas from our Libraries

Last week we had recommendations from Mr Grist and this week, take a look at **Mr Laouira's recommendations**!




Our Books of the Week



Tub-To-Pub 2026

As the season of over-indulgence (and excessive plastic) is upon us, Mr Wragg will once again be collecting plastic Celebrations / Heroes / Roses / Cracker tubs to be recycled and raise funds for Macmillan Cancer Support. Further information can be found at $\underline{\text{TUB2PUB}}$. Last year the school collected 127 tubs which was fantastic, 52 more than the previous year and potentially 127 less tubs going to landfill. Overall the campaign collected 240,000 tubs raising £10,916 for Macmillan. Tubs should be handed into Form Tutors or the staff room with the final collection being 6 February 2026. **It's an environmental win-win!**

Juniors Drive
