### Children's Mental Health Week

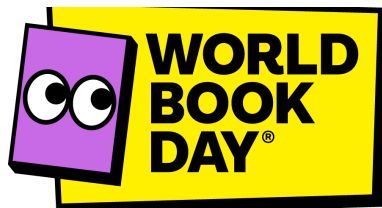

## FROM THE OFFICE

**Reminder - Cashless Catering:** Please ensure your child's cashless catering account is topped up and any outstanding balances are cleared

### **Breakfast Club**

Please ensure your child is not dropped off before 7:30 am, as they are not permitted in the building until this time. We kindly ask that you do not ring the doorbell prior to 7:30 am to allow staff time to prepare. When dropping off your child, please remember to confirm with a teacher that they have been officially marked on the register before you leave.

### **Gate opening and closing times**

To avoid missing the gate, please ensure children are on the playground by around 8.40am, when the whistle goes for lining up. If the gate is locked, please drop your child at the front of the school. The gate is open from 8.15am to 8.45am prompt, though it may be locked a minute or two early to allow staff to get to class on time. It is essential for safety that staff are in the classrooms promptly with the children.

At the end of the day, the gate opens at 3.30pm, closes at 4.00pm, and reopens at 5.00pm until approximately 5.10pm. On Fridays, pick-up arrangements are slightly different due to Click & Collect, but the usual arrangements for collection from After School Care remain the same.

### **Hot Drinks**

Please ensure that any hot drinks brought for children are fully consumed before entering the school site in the mornings.

### **End of Day Collections**

If you are collecting your child from the front office, please knock on the office door and ask the School Administrator, Mrs Gill, or the School Secretary, Miss Gerrish, to radio the class teacher to bring your child to the office. For safeguarding reasons, parents are not permitted to enter classrooms.

### **School Closure Policy**

A reminder that if school is closed due to weather conditions or any other reason, an announcement will be posted on our website, so please check there as your main source of information. Depending on the circumstances for the closure we will also communicate via text message or email and separate communications will be sent directly from Vectare regarding coach operation.

### **Tub-To-Pub 2026**

Mr Wragg will once again be collecting plastic Celebrations / Heroes / Roses / Cracker tubs to be recycled and raise funds for Macmillan Cancer Support. Further information can be found at [TUB2PUB](#). Last year the school collected 127 tubs which was fantastic, 52 more than the previous year and potentially 127 less tubs going to landfill. Overall the campaign collected 240,000 tubs raising £10,916 for Macmillan. Tubs should be handed into Form Tutors or the staff room with the final collection being 6 February 2026. **It's an environmental win-win!**
